Every year, the Annie E. Casey Foundation releases the *Kids Count Data Book*, a comprehensive, 50-state look at child welfare. Arkansas made gains in health coverage and education over the last year, but the child poverty rate went up to 29 percent. Those ups and downs are consistent with national trends, but what would it take for Arkansas to climb all the way up to the top? The tables below show the numbers Arkansas would have to reach to meet the U.S. average, and to be number one.
