New Plan to Improve Reenrollment Process

The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, Arkansas Advocates and the Arkansas Department of Human Services have teamed up to improve the reenrollment efforts of ARKids A and B in our state. One of our very own project sites, Poplar House, serves as the local outreach partner for the project. Through the "Arkansas Process Improvement Project" the pilot site calls families in Washington county that have not turned in their re-enrollment forms. Parents/guardians of the ARKids recipients are then asked if they would like to conduct re-enrollment via the phone. If so, a series of questions are asked (regarding change of address, household composition, income, child care, health insurance and primary care physician) and the proper forms are completed as the adult

answers the questions. The project is moving along great and the pilot site is amending some things month to month as it notices better ways to conduct phone interviews. When the data is gathered electronically, it will be forwarded to each pilot site so you can get a better idea of how the project is going.
