Track the voting record of your Legislators and the Governor on *Issues Critical to Children* in 2005

Arkansas Advocates for Children and Families, in partnership with its supporters and allies, has identified key legislative issues impacting children and families that will likely be considered by members of the Arkansas General Assembly during the 2005 legislative session. Among the more important issues they will face: preschool education, health care, funding for programs critical to the well-being of children, economic self-sufficiency and fair taxes. We urge voters and constituents to consider these issues and monitor the progress of the General Assembly while it is in session.



This guide is designed to help citizens track the voting records of their legislators on important issues relating to children. During 2004, the Arkansas legislature held a special session to comply with an Arkansas Supreme Court mandate to reform K-12 education. In response, the Arkansas General Assembly increased funding for pre-school and K-12 education by \$400 million dollars.

One issue not addressed during the special session was the funding of school facilities. Arkansas will have to dramatically increase spending on facilities to comply with the court's mandate. This raises two very important questions. How much will they spend on facilities, and what will they do on other issues vital to children?
