

How to receive the “Economic Impact Payment”

One provision of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act was a direct payment of up to \$1,200 for each adult (or \$2,400 for couples filing jointly) and \$500 per dependent child under 17.

IF YOU FILED 2018 OR 2019 TAXES

AUTO-DEPOSIT OR PAPER CHECK



The deposit will be made automatically if the IRS has your direct deposit information.

Otherwise a paper check will be mailed to you.

The IRS will set up a web portal to allow filers to give them direct deposit information or change their mailing address to ensure payment.

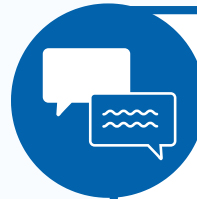
IF YOU HAVEN'T FILED 2018 OR 2019 TAXES

IF YOU RECEIVE SOCIAL SECURITY OR RAILROAD RETIREMENT BENEFITS



The deposit will be made automatically.

FOR OTHER REASONS, SUCH AS HAVING NO INCOME



The IRS has set up for non-filers to enter their information here.

Required information includes:

- Full name, current mailing address and an email address
- Date of birth and valid Social Security number
- Bank account number, type and routing number, if you have one
- Identity Protection Personal Identification Number (IP PIN) you received from the IRS earlier this year, if you have one
- Driver's license or state-issued ID, if you have one
- For each qualifying child: name, Social Security number or Adoption Taxpayer Identification Number and their relationship to you or your spouse

ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?

YOU MAY NOT BE ELIGIBLE IF:

- Your adjusted gross income is above \$99,000 (for individuals) or \$198,000 (for couples)
- You are claimed as a dependent on someone else's return
- Any member of your household does not have a social security number, including children.
 - With limited exceptions for adopted children and military families
