

WHAT'S THE PROBLEM?

THE STATE'S TAX AND BUDGET SYSTEM is unfair to working families and small businesses. By taxing lower-income workers at a higher percentage of their earnings than wealthier citizens, the tax system puts disproportionate burdens on those who can least afford it. Low- and middle-income families pay 12 cents of every dollar they earn in state and local taxes, compared to 6 cents on every dollar paid by the richest one percent of taxpayers, according to the Institute on Taxation and Economic Policy.





Families who are struggling to make ends meet should not be forced to pay a higher share of their incomes to support our collective needs. Additionally, some large corporations receive more favorable treatment under the tax system, which leaves small businesses at a competitive disadvantage.

TO HELP WORKING FAMILIES move ahead, our state and federal tax and budget systems must provide adequate resources for the public services that we all depend upon. These include quality health care, good schools and safe roads. These services are critical if our state and its citizens want to compete in a global economy. Unfortunately, our tax and budget systems do not always produce enough revenue to meet the needs of all Arkansas residents.





As citizens we must fight for a fair and responsible tax and budget system. Those who earn the most should pay a higher percentage of their incomes on taxes than those who are just barely scraping by. Arkansas's sales taxes, for example, put a greater strain on the wallets of lower-income people who spend a higher percentage of their earnings on such basics as food.

A state and federal tax system in which everyone, including the wealthy and corporations, pays their fair share will give our state the resources it needs to help children and families thrive and will pave the way to a better future for all Arkansas residents, not just a select few.
